**Public Hearing for Laytonville Downtown Plan**

A local project in Laytonville known as “Traffic Calming & Downtown Revitalization: Planning for a Livable Community” has been recently completed. Mendocino Council of Governments (MCOG) will receive a presentation and accept the final plan in a public hearing.

Presentation and acceptance of the plan are on MCOG’s agenda for Monday, February 4 at 1:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, 300 Seminary Avenue, Ukiah. The complete agenda may be viewed at [www.mendocinocog.org](http://www.mendocinocog.org), or by contacting the MCOG office at 463-1859.

Started in spring of 2007, the project is sponsored by MCOG and funded by a Caltrans Community Based Transportation Planning grant. Partners include the Laytonville Area Municipal Advisory Council, Local Government Commission, County of Mendocino, the Cahto Tribe, and planning consultants. Local community “stakeholders” were involved in a participatory design process. A draft conceptual plan was presented to MCOG in a public meeting in Laytonville last October.

Acting as the Regional Transportation Planning Agency, MCOG programs or allocates various types of state and federal transportation funds to Caltrans, the County of Mendocino and the four incorporated Cities of Ukiah, Fort Bragg, Willits, and Point Arena. In addition to projects on state highways and within its five member jurisdictions, MCOG helps support transportation activities of the Mendocino Transit Authority, North Coast Rail Authority, local airports, and others. Projects involve planning, capital improvements, rehabilitation and maintenance, fleet replacement, and intermodal transit centers.
